'The numbers choose the method you use'

You may hear your child saying this phrase at home. When adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing numbers, we ask pupils to look carefully at the numbers and then select an appropriate method to answer the question. There may be an easier or quicker way to solve it.

e.g. 101 - 98

We would expect the children to 'count up' from 98 to 101, as this is easier than taking 98 away from 101.
