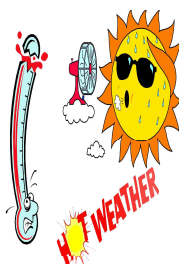

### Safeguarding - Tip of the Week

Create complex passwords. We know you have heard it before, but creating strong, unique passwords for all your critical accounts really is the best way to keep your personal and financial information safe. This is especially true in the era of widespread corporate hacks, where one database breach can reveal tens of thousands of user passwords. If you reuse your passwords, a hacker can take the leaked data from one attack and use it to login to other accounts. Hacked account information is often shared on the dark web amongst cybercriminals.
