Hollyfield Primary School have a high-quality music curriculum that engages and inspires pupils to develop a love of music, which knows no boundaries of language, race or background. At Hollyfield, we believe music echoes through the heart of each child, filling them with self-belief and confidence in their own abilities. The Kapow curriculum that we follow, provides the children opportunities to develop flair across a range of genres and styles covering historically important composers and modern-day songs. This curriculum enables children to meet they key stage attainment targets in the National Curriculum. As pupils progress, they develop a critical engagement with music, allowing them to explore, compose and develop their talents as a musician.

Using a wide range of instruments across the school, allows the children to understand how sounds are made and organised into musical structures, helping them form their own judgements about the quality of music. Music at Hollyfield brings together young people through the shared endeavour of singing in lessons, ensemble playing and experimenting with the artistic process of creating music.

We enrich the music curriculum by delivering whole class instrumental lessons such as ukulele, glockenspiels and recorders. We also take part in the Young Voices choir each year, which is always a great success.
