Learning Knows No Bounds

At Hollyfield we endeavour to give all children equality of access to all lessons. Teachers help children to understand their work and break down any barriers to learning they may have to enable them to fully participate in all lessons. Teachers use differentiation and a variety of resources to support children. These resources might include things such as: word banks, writing frames and the use of dual coding. Children may also receive individual and group support, when required.



As we fill our homes with more and more internet connected devices we increase our cyber security risks. The National Cyber Security Centre this week reported that some home security devices have been accessed by hackers. In Leeds, a family were spied upon 1000's of times without their knowledge and a baby camera was used to speak to a child with the hacker pretending to be Father Christmas. It is always best to change default passwords on any devices that you install. Keep devices up to date, manufacturers will release firmware for the devices themselves. These updates will keep them more secure. Turn off the device, camera feature or microphone features when not needed as this will also reduce the risk of hackers being able to gain access or take over.
