



Attendance Matters

Every student. Every day.

Thank you to the many children who arrive at school on time every day. Unfortunately, there are a number of children who regularly arrive late for school. We would like to remind you that the doors open at 8.45am and the bell for the start of school is rung at 8.50am. The start of the day is a very important time for children to socialise and take part in the many learning interventions which take place at that time. The class registers are marked first thing. If your child arrives late, but before 9.10am they will receive a late mark. If they arrive after the registers close after 9.10am, then they will receive an unauthorised absence and this will have an impact on their overall attendance.

Just 5 minutes late each day equates to 3 days of lost learning!
