Attendance Matters

We would like to thank parents/carers who bring their children to school on time on a regular basis. This will have a positive impact on their life at school. However, there are a number of pupils who regularly arrive at school after the bell has rung. We would like to make you aware of the importance of pupils arriving at school on time regularly. This is important for both their social interactions and academic progress. It also creates good habits for the future. We work alongside CSAWS (Central Schools Attendance and Welfare Service Ltd), who support us with attendance issues. A member of their staff will be on site in the coming weeks to speak to parents when children arrive late for school. We would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers that it is important to be prompt when collecting your children at the end of the day. We would like to remind you that school starts promptly at 8.50am and ends at 3:15pm for Key stage 1 and 3:20pm for Key stage 2.



In maths and real life, telling the time is so important. By the end of Year 2, we would like children to be able to read the time on an analogue clock to the nearest five minutes. By the end of Year 4, children will have worked on converting the time on digital and analogue clocks and solving problems involving time. By the end of Year 6, we would like children to be able to tackle a range of problems involving timetables, calendars and graphs, so... keep practising.

YouTube

Unlike regular TV, YouTube offers young people the chance to be content creators as well as consumers. YouTubing can be a very lucrative and nowadays many youngsters see this as a potential career. With companies now using Youtubers or influencers to promote their goods it's easy to see why it's so popular.

If your child uses YouTube and wants to create their own channel, you should be aware that YouTube doesn't allow children under 13 to create their own channel and so as a parent you should take ownership and manage the content for them. 13-17 year olds can do so but only with parental permission.
