Safeguarding - Tip of the Week

Public WIFI is not as safe as you may think. These are usually open networks that anyone can freely join, people could be connected to the same network snooping on other connected devices, and they may be able to view what you send and receive. It is safer to use 3G, 4G or 5G and your mobile providers data services for email, banking and other sensitive browsing when out and about as this will reduce the risk of hackers seeing what you are doing.
