Year 2 Autumn Term


English

In English, pupils will be planning and writing a range of fiction and non-fiction such as a character description, a postcard and a recipe.

The children will also continue to develop their spelling, grammar and punctuation. There will be a focus on writing sentences independently with the correct punctuation.

They will further develop their writing by: writing compound sentences using different conjunctions; using exclamation and question marks; and including more descriptive language.





Reading books will be sent home every Friday in your child's reading folder. These are to be returned the following Wednesday (please note, we cannot send a new book home until the previous one is retuned). Children will also bring home a book to read for pleasure. They are to return this on Wednesday along with the Reading Practice book, or once they have completed reading it if it is a longer chapter book. Our author focus this term is Nadia Shireen.

Maths

This term, children will complete a sequence of learning in: place value: addition and subtraction; and multiplication and division.

Children will continue to learn, use and apply their basic maths skills such as number bonds, doubles and times tables. This will help them to build their rapid recall in increase their fluency.

Science

In Science, the children will learn about 'Animals Including Humans', They will name animal young and compare them to

their adults. They will be introduced to, and describe the life cycles of a variety of common animals including humans, butterflies and frogs.



Art

The children will freely experiment with different tools to learn how to draw lines of different thicknesses. They will use observational skills to add details to their drawings and learn how to use a range of marks to draw different textures. They will also learn how to draw facial features in different ways to convey expressions.

They will look at the illustrator Quentin Blake to draw in his style.

History

Music

Our topics this term are The Great Fire of London and Guy Fawkes. The children will learn to order events

chronologically on a timeline and compare London from 17th Century to London today. To support their understanding of the causes of the Great Fire of London, they will look at a range of different sources of evidence. On our visit to Blakesley Hall, in October, (letter to follow) they will act out the events leading to the fire.

They will ask and answer questions about the past whilst studying the life of Guy Fawkes and order the events leading up to the gunpowder plot. The children will learn about the main food groups and identify foods that belong to each group. The children will be working towards creating a healthy wrap. When deciding what they would like for their healthy wrap, they will research and taste test different ingredients and describe the taste, texture and smell of them. Then they will construct a wrap that meets the design brief and their plan.

DT

Children will be learning different folk songs from The British Isles. Within this unit, children will:

- sing, play and follow instructions to perform as a group
- describe music using musical vocabulary
- explore multiple ways of making the same sound.
- represent the same sound in different ways
- create a piece that clearly represents a particular environment
- extend a piece of music so that it represents three distinct environments

PSHE & RE


